Dear friends,

It's hard to believe we are more than halfway through our fall semester. This fall we welcomed our newest class of 277 J.D. students, a quarter of whom identify as first generation, represent 80 universities and 21 states.



The entering class was admitted from the largest application pool in the school's history — 2,366 applicants and our enrollment numbers continue to climb amid a national decline in law school applications.

Our class is majority-minority, with 45% identifying as Hispanic or Latino, 4% as Asian American and 3% as Black or African American. More than 30% join us from South Texas or rural areas of the state.

We are making strides toward a bench and bar more reflective of our population, and the diversity of our students shows it.

Moving forward

We have completed a five-year strategic plan with campaign priorities looking toward the School of Law's centennial in 2027, and forward into its second century. We will share our plans with you in the months ahead.

The American Bar Association will make its sabbatical visit for reaccreditation this fall. While it requires comprehensive work reviewing our programs, it also encourages us to reflect on how much progress we are making. This momentum includes a \$690,000 grant to support a new Housing Rights Clinic, which builds on the outstanding and impactful work of our Consumer Protection Clinic during the pandemic.

Getting back together

This month, we gathered for the first time since 2019 to celebrate nine new **Distinguished Law Graduates** at the exceptional dinner hosted by the Law Alumni Association and attended by more than 600 alumni and friends.

We will also renew our commitment to incorporating our Catholic and Marianist faith, mission and values into our work as members of the legal profession and guardians of the rule of law at **Red Mass** on Thursday, Oct. 27. We have so much for which to give thanks!
